JANUARY 23, 2022 HIEROMARTYR CLEMENT, BISHOP OF ANCYRA

On January 23 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the holy Hieromartyr Clement, Bishop of Ancyra, and the holy Martyr Agathangelos.

The thirst of the inclement sword hath been sated on the blood of Agathangelos and Clement. Ye were felled on the twenty-third, O Agathangelos and Clement.

Clement was born in 258 in the city of Ancyra in Galatia of a pagan father and a Christian mother. Clement was so famous because of his virtuous living that he was elected bishop of Ancyra at the age of 20. In his young years, he attained the wisdom of a mature adult, and by great restraint he tamed and conquered his body. During the reign of Diocletian, he was tortured so horribly and spent 28 years in difficulties and in dungeons. Clement considered it a great honor



to be tortured because, as he said, "even the mouth of my Lord Jesus Christ was also beaten and struck in the face and behold, I, the unworthy, now became worthy of that!" Finally, he and Saint Agathangelos of Rome were beheaded together in 312.

On this day, we also commemorate Paulinos, bishop of Nola.

By their holy intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us and save us. Amen.

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE SIX

When Mary stood at Thy grave, looking for Thy sacred body, angelic powers shone above Thy revered tomb; and the soldiers who were to keep guard became as dead men. Thou led Hades captive and wast not tempted thereby. Thou didst meet the Virgin and didst give life to the world, O Thou, Who art risen from the dead, O Lord, glory to Thee.

APOLYTIKION OF ST. CLEMENT OF ANCYRA IN TONE FOUR

Thou didst blossom forth for the faithful, O most sacred Clement, as a branch of holiness, a staff of contest, a most sacred flower, and a sweet God-given fruit. But as a fellow-sufferer of martyrs and a fellow-prelate of hierarchs, intercede with Christ our God that our souls be saved.

KONTAKION OF THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST IN TONE ONE

Thou, O Christ God, Who by Thy Birth, didst sanctify the Virgin's womb, and, as is meet, didst bless Simeon's arms, and didst also come to save us; preserve Thy fold in wars, and confirm them whom Thou didst love, for Thou alone art the Lover of mankind.

THE EPISTLE

O Lord, save Thy people, and bless Thine inheritance. Unto Thee have I cried, O Lord, my God.

The Reading from the First Epistle of St. Paul to St. Timothy. (1:15-17)

Timothy, my son, the saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. And I am the foremost of sinners; but I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display His perfect patience for an example to those who were to believe in Him for eternal life. To the King of Ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory to the ages of ages. Amen.

THE GOSPEL

The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (18:35-43)

At that time, as Jesus drew near to Jericho, a blind man was sitting by the roadside begging; and hearing a multitude going by, he inquired what this meant. They told him, "Jesus of Nazareth is passing by." And he cried, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" And those who were in front rebuked him, telling him to be silent; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" And Jesus stopped, and commanded him to be brought to Him; and when he came near, Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, let me receive my sight." And Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed Him, glorifying God; and all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

WISDOM

In the practical life, asceticism is of the utmost importance. Yet even though asceticism is a spiritual means to a spiritual end, it remains a virtue of the body. There are many different kinds of ascetic practices, such as the "guarding of the mind," but this is purely an activity, an exercise: it is not itself an element of the spiritual life. It is something that by itself is incomplete; it is something that takes place on the level of human effort. Asceticism is not an end in itself. It is not something that enables me to stand before God; in fact it ensures me no place before God. All it can do is attract God, if I may put it this way. Any form of asceticism not undertaken for this purpose will remain outside the field of divine encounter; it will never enable me to receive God. My asceticism therefore must always take place in relation to God, in order to attract God and draw Him closer to me. And I attract God when I confess, by means of my asceticism, my sinfulness and my weakness and my incapacity; when I acknowledge that, on my own, I am absolutely unable to do anything spiritual.

If I should receive divine contemplations, then my asceticism has the following meaning and makes me say: "God, you gave me this experience of grace, this contemplation, but I am still who I am: I am earth, ash, clay, soil, flesh, naked, nothing at all. It is only you who make me rich. My life without you is like the world without light: nothing has form or shape, nothing is clearly visible; I can't see anything anywhere, things vanish from before my eyes, they are lost, and I am lost without you. I find the substance of my being, the meaning of my life, only in the light of your grace, only when you bestow upon me these spiritual insights and contemplations, which is the revelation of your presence, the contemplation and vision of you."

Thus it is through ascetic practice that I discover my identity; it is through asceticism that I come to recognize who I am, my nature, that I am earth and ash. And I express my humble condition by being grateful for the gift that God has given me. And when God sees my gratitude, He is moved to give me even more. But asceticism by itself is not able to raise me up even a little bit above the earth if I do not have the experience of ongoing contemplations.




